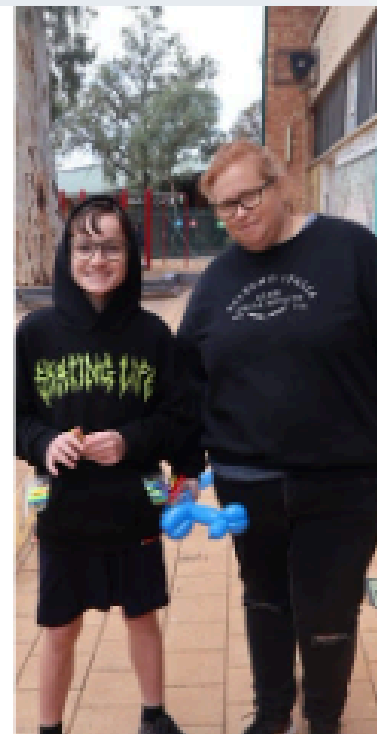
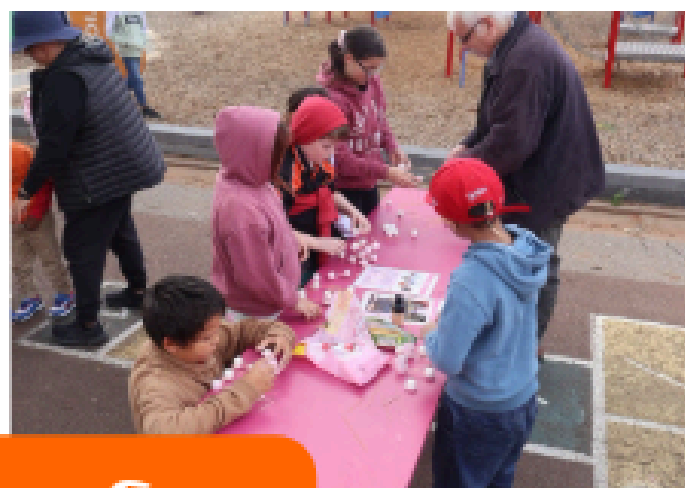
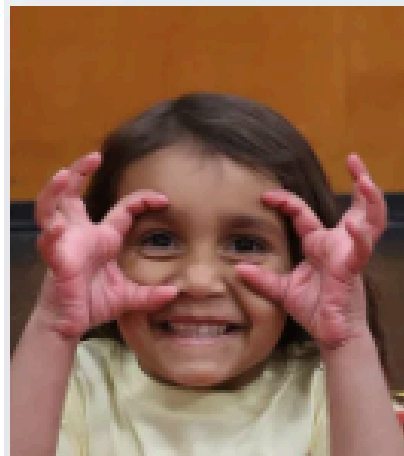
HASS (Civics)

In HASS, we've been learning Civics and have been learning about the separation of powers in Australia's system of government. We've talked about how important it is to keep powers in check and have a balance of power through discussing interesting scenarios, such as a group of people winning the lottery.

Who are the power sharers?	Identify possible risks	Solutions
Every single person who bought the ticket/ All 3 people	The person who has all the money in their account refuses to share the money with other 2 people.	Before buying the ticket, sign a contract that agrees everyone will get the same amount of money.
Checks and balance	How the solution is recorded?	Why is separation of powers important?
If some members refuse to sign, then do not buy the ticket.	Have a lawyer to witness the signing process./Have a lawyer to make sure the signing is going to happen.	Because if one person has all the money, they could be selfish and refuse to share. It is not fair for the other two people.

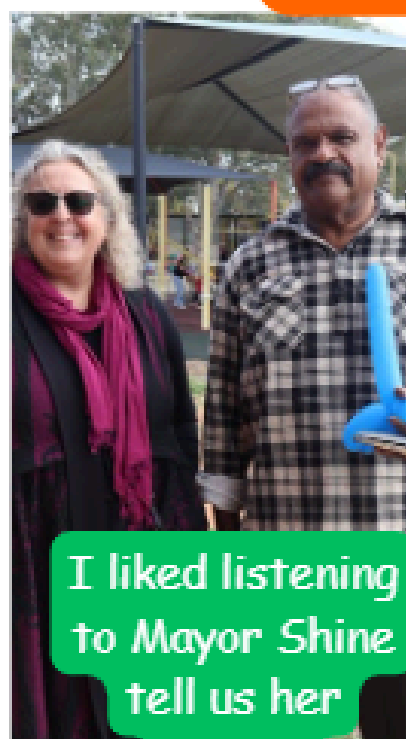
Maths

In Maths, we've been developing our understanding of place value by learning to unitise and rename 3-digit numbers. Specifically, a 3-digit number can be unitised to any of the 3 places (e.g., 345 is 345 Ones; 345 is also 34 Tens and 5 Ones, and 345 is 3 Hundreds and 45 Ones). Thinking in this manner with whole numbers will prepare us to understand the concept of decimals.

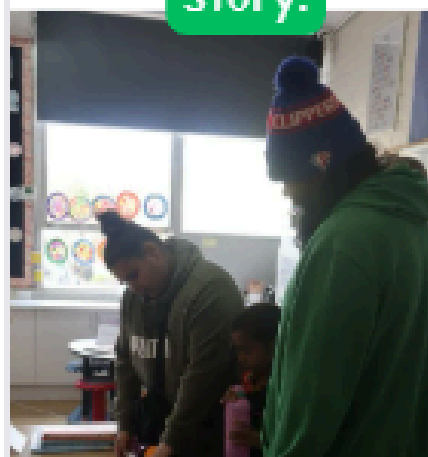

I liked listening to Mayor Shine tell us her story.



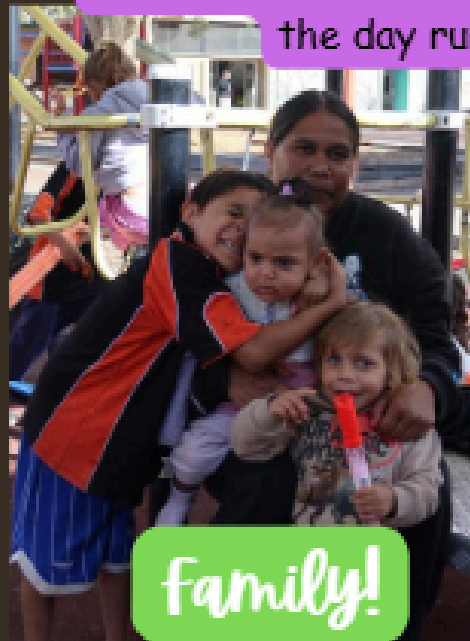

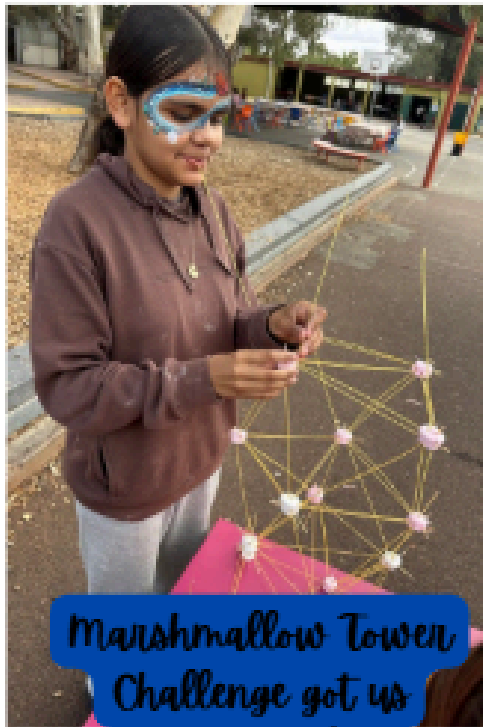
